Curriculum Overview for Early Years Foundation Stage Summer Term 1 2016 (Greenshoots)

Personal, Social & Emotional Development

- Separates from main carer with encouragement.
- Interested in others' play and starting to join in.
- Can play in a group, extending and elaborating play ideas.
- Expresses own preferences and interests.
- Begin to learn that some things are shared and some things belong to others.
- Shows understanding and cooperates with some boundaries and routines.
- Confident to talk to other children when playing and will communicate freely about own home and community.

Communication & Language

- Shows an interest in play with sounds, songs and rhymes. •
- Joins in with repeated refrains and anticipates key events and phrases in rhymes and stories. •
- Responds to simple instructions. •
- Uses language as a means of sharing feelings, experiences and thoughts. •
- Understands more complex sentences. •
- Enjoys rhymes and demonstrates listening by trying to join in with actions or vocalisations •
- Listens to stories with increasing attention and recall.



Physical Development

- Moves freely with confidence in a range of ways.
- Beginning to show a preference for dominant hand.
- Uses one handed tools and equipment.
- Runs safely on whole foot.
- Climbs confidently on play climbing equipment.
- Drinks well without spilling
- Gains more control and can attend to toileting needs most of the time themselves.

Literacy

- Has some favourite songs and rhymes.
- Distinguishes between different marks they make.
- Sometimes give meaning to marks as they draw and paint.
- Listens to stories with increasing attention and recall.
- Suggest how a story might end.
- Beginning to be aware of the way stories are structured.
- Knows information can be relayed in the form of print.

Mathematics

- Recite some number names in sequence.
- Use number names accurately in play.
- Match numeral and quantity correctly.
- Shows an interest in number problems.
- Beginning to categorise objects according to properties such as shape and size. Anticipate time based events e.g. lunch, home time. Show an interest in shape and space by playing with shapes or making arrangements with objects.
- Show interest in shape by sustained construction activity or by talking about shapes or arrangements.

Understanding the World

- Has a sense of own immediate family and relations.
- Talk about significant events in own experience.
- Enjoys playing with small world models.
- Notices detailed features in their environment.
- Seek to acquire basic skills in turning on and operating ICT equipment.
- Knows how to operate simple equipment e.g. CD player, remote control.

Expressive Arts and Design

- Experiments with blocks, colours and marks.
- Joins in singing favourite songs.
- Imitates movement in response to music.
- Realises tools can be used for a purpose.
- Beginning to describe the texture of things.
- Begin to make-believe by pretending.
- Engage in imaginative role-play based on own first hand experiences.
- Uses available resources to create props to support role-play.
