# Curriculum Overview for Early Years Foundation Stage Summer Term 2 2018 (Greenshoots)

## **Personal, Social & Emotional Development**

#### **Making Relationships**

- Interested in others' play and starting to join in.
- Can play in a group, extending and elaborating play ideas.

#### **Self- confidence and Self-awareness**

- Confident to talk with other children when playing. Will communicate freely about own home and community.
- Confident to speak to others about own needs, wants, interests and opinions.

#### **Managing Feelings and Behaviour**

- Responds to the feelings and wishes of others.
- Aware of the boundaries set and behavioural expectations in the setting

# Communication & Language

#### **Listening and Attention**

- Joins in with repeated refrains and anticipates key events and phrases in rhymes and stories.
- Listens to stories with increasing attention and recall.

#### **Understanding**

- Understands more complex sentences.
- Shows understanding of prepositions 'under', 'on top', 'behind'.

#### Speaking

- Can retell a past event in correct order.
- Uses a range of tenses.
- Uses language as a means of sharing feelings, experiences and thoughts.
- Links statements and sticks to a main theme.

# **Physical Development**

#### **Moving and Handling**

- Moves freely with confidence in a range of ways.
- Runs skilfully, negotiating space, adjusting speed to avoid obstacles.
- Beginning to use tripod grip to hold writing tools.
- Can copy some letters.

#### **Health and Self-Care**

- Gains more control and can attend to toileting needs most of the time themselves.
- Observe the effects of activity on their body.

### Literacy

#### Reading

- Listens to stories with increasing attention and recall.
- Suggest how a story might end.
- Beginning to be aware of the way stories are structured.
- Knows information can be relayed in the form of print.
- Enjoys rhyming and rhythmic activities.

#### Writing

- Distinguishes between different marks they make.
- Sometimes give meaning to marks as they draw and paint.
- Ascribe meaning to marks that they see in different places.

## **Mathematics**

#### Numbers

- Use number names accurately in play.
- Match numeral and quantity correctly.
- Shows an interest in number problems.
- Shows an interest in numerals in the environment.

#### hape, space and Measure

Beginning to categorise objects according to properties such as shape and size.

- Show an interest in shape and space by playing with shapes or making arrangements with objects.
- Show interest in shape by sustained construction activity or by talking about shapes or arrangements.
- Uses positional language.

# **Understanding the World**

#### **People and communities**

- Talk about significant events in own experience.
- Beginning to have their own friends.

#### The World

- Comments and asks questions about aspects of their familiar world or the natural world.
- Talks about why things happen and how things work.

#### Technology

• Shows skill in making toys work.



# Expressive Arts and Design Explore Media and Materials

- Tap out simple repeated rhythms
- Beginning to describe the texture of things.
- Understand they can use lines to enclose a space. Use these shapes to represent objects.

#### **Being Imaginative**

- Begin to make-believe by pretending.
- Engages in imaginative role-play based on own first hand experiences.
- Uses available resources to create props to support role-play.
